EXAMINATION RULES

CONTINUOUS INTERNAL ASSESSMENT (CIA)

- There shall be **two Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA)** test in each semester and the results are communicated to the parents.
- Parents are requested to follow up the academic performance of their wards and may also discuss with the Student's Counsellor. Special coaching classes will be conducted regularly for those Students who do not perform well in the internal assessment examinations. The passing minimum for CIA shall be 40% out of 25/15* marks (i.e. 10/6* marks) in Theory papers and 40% out of 40/10* marks (i.e. 16/4* marks) in Practical Examinations.

END SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS

- There shall be University Examinations at the end of each semester, for Odd semesters in the month of October / November, for Even semesters in April / May. The candidate who does not pass the examination in any course(s) shall be permitted to appear in such failed courses in the subsequent examinations to be held in October / November or April / May.
- The passing minimum for University Examinations shall be 40% out of 75/60*marks (i.e. 30/24* marks) for Theory papers and 40% out of 60/40* marks (i.e. 24/16* marks) for Practical papers.

ATTENDANCE/CONDONATION

- Students must have 75% of attendance in each course for appearing the examination.
- Students who have below 60% of attendance are not eligible to appear for the examination. They shall re-do the semester(s) after completion of the programme.

COLLEGE STUDENTS CODE OF CONDUCT

Students are expected to maintain the highest standards of discipline and dignified manner of behavior inside as well as outside the college campus. They shall abide by the rules and regulations of the college and should act in a way that highlights the discipline and esteem of the college.

GENERAL RULES OF DISCIPLINE

1. By accepting a membership of the College, the students accept an obligation to obey its rules and to respect and maintain its discipline.
2. Every student shall attend the classes regularly and punctually.
3. Every student shall wear uniform chudidhar with an over cot bearing ID card over it.
4. All students of the College are expected to co-operate with the authorities of the College in keeping the Seminar Hall, varandas, premises or buildings and play grounds clean and tidy.
5. Mobile Phone is strictly banned in the College.
6. When a teacher enters a class room the students shall stand up till they are asked to sit down.
7. When the principal or a visitor enters a class room students shall stand up and will remain standing till they are asked to sit down.
8. Students are expected to wish teachers and elders with their folded hands by saying 'Vanakkam' or 'Namaste' as a token of respect.
9. Ragging or anything of that kind will be a criminal offence as per High Court order.

ANTI - RAGGING ACT

RAGGING IS AN OFFENCE PUNISHABLE AS PER LAW – RESULTING IN IMPRISONMENT AND / OR HEAVY PENALTY

(REF: University Grants Commission Circular No.F.1 – 16/2009 (CPP-II), Dated September 2009 as per the order of the Hon. Supreme Court of a India vide Ref.No.in SLP No.24295 of 2006)

Ragging means causing physical and / or mental trauma to person as a result of physical abuse, manhandling, using abusive language or gestures or forcing to perform acts that may cause physical / mental damage. Ragging is a social, cultural and psychological menace. Students are urged to keep-up the glorious tradition of PURATCHI THALAIVAR DR.M.G.R GROUP OF INSTITUTION and not to indulge in any activity within or outside the campus that may be construed as or amounts to ragging. Any Student, if found involved in any such activity directly or indirectly shall not only be expelled from the Institution, but the matter will be reported to police / legal authorities, for further necessary action.

10. When you have doubts in any matter of the College discipline, consult the principal before making your final decision.
11. No Students are allowed to enter or leave for class room when the session is on without the permission of the concerned teacher.
12. The authority of the principal in matters of the discipline of students extends outside the College premises and is final.
13. Any notice signed or counter signed by the principal and published on the College notice board, shall be considered as having been brought to the members of the College.
14. Use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the College Campus.
15. Students are advised to discuss their grievances if any with their mentors, HOD's or members of the grievance Redressal cell.

COLLEGE TIMINGS

A six day working schedule from Monday to Saturday is followed. The College functions from 9.45 a.m. to 3.50 p.m. Students are expected to reach the College before 9.30 a.m and are not allowed to leave the campus before 3.50 p.m. The classes will begin with a silent prayer. Visitors are strictly not allowed to meet students during the academic hours.

OFFICE HOURS

- Timings for fee payment: 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.
- Timings for other transactions: 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- Request for any type of certificate or documents should be addressed to the Principal and submitted in the college office.

COLLECTION OF FEES

1. Fees will be collected in three installments at the beginning of each semester respectively.
2. Each installment shall be paid on the dates notified on the College Notice Board.
3. All cash transactions will be closed at 2.30 pm every day.
4. A receipt signed by the Accountant will be issued for every payment made which the student should preserve and produce whenever required.
5. Mistakes, if any, in the receipts issued for payments made, should be pointed out then and there and corrections made on the spot Complaints made later will not be entertained.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

In case of any misbehaviour or violation of the college rules, ID cards of the students will be with the **Disciplinary Committee** members till the enquiry is over.

RAGGING

Ragging is strictly banned in our institution. Any student found indulging in ragging will be punished appropriately as per the rules in force and as per the orders passed by the Honorable Supreme Court of India. Any student who has been affected by an act of ragging shall make a complaint to the Principal.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE

- Attendance will be marked compulsorily on the reopening day of the college.
- Regular attendance in the classroom as well as in the laboratory is expected of all the students.
- Attendance will be taken at every lecture, lab or any kind prescribed in the college timetable.
- The Students absenting continuously for 15 days without a valid reason and proper leave application will be expelled by Principal.
- All leave applications must be signed by the parent or guardian and must be recommended by the Head of the Department and finally it must be countersigned by the principal and kept under the custody of class in-charge.
- Students suffering from sickness for more than 5 consecutive working days shall produce a valid Medical Certificate.
- Students who intend to represent the college in intercollegiate events shall take prior permission from the concerned Head of the Department and the selection will be based on parameters such as academic performance, attendance, character, existing academic pressure and competence of the student in the proposed event for participation.
- For Non-technical / Cultural events OD will be given, only to the prize winners, after furnishing certificates.

PARENT – TEACHER ASSOCIATION

- Parent – Teacher Association meeting shall be conducted just after each internal examinations for discussing various matters of student's welfare and assess their performance in the examinations.
- The students will be issued conduct certificate only after fulfilling the above stipulated rules and regulations and as per the recommendation of the department.
- No student shall enter or leave the class room when the session is on without the permission of the teacher concerned.
- Students can leave the campus during class hours only after getting a gate pass from the Principal, HOD, or the staff-in-charge and after making entry in the Gate Register maintained by the gate keeper.
- It is strongly advised to refrain from activities such as scribbling or noting on walls, door or furniture which could deface the college and destroy the academic ambiance.
- Carefully handle the furniture, equipments, fixtures and appliances of the college and lab. Careless handling / misuse of the above could result personal injuries or damage to property.
- In case of any instance of noncompliance of existing rules or any observed matter/behaviour that deviates from vision and mission of MGRASCW, all staff members are empowered to initiate disciplinary procedure by filling in a standard form which in turn may lead to the constitution of an enquiry committee and further proceedings.

SALIENT FEATURES

CLASS ROOMS

Class rooms of our College are capable of accommodating a good number of students. They are spacious and well ventilated. The classrooms are well equipped with ICT facilities such as LCD projectors.

PHYSICS LAB

The College emphasizes on practical training of the students. Laboratories are the essential features of learning science. All the science departments are provided with well-equipped and sophisticated instruments. These labs serve as potential centres for project works.

INTERNET ENABLED COMPUTER LAB

Traditionally, computer labs have been configured to support teaching and learning by providing rows of computers in a lecture-style classroom set-up. Lab computers and software allow students to complete course assignments or learn new programs. Our College has a state-of-the art Hi-tech internet enabled computer lab, to improve technical skills and encourage continuous support to students, helping them to familiarize with tech-savvy modern work places and thus preparing them for their careers.

LIBRARY

The quality of higher education institutions is multi-dimensional. The NAAC has recognized the importance of library and information services to evaluate the quality of the learning resource centre as part of the assessment of the quality of higher education institutions.

LIBRARY RULES

1. All members of the staff and students of the college whose names as on the rolls of the college are members of the library.
2. All books, Umbrellas etc. should be deposited at the property counter. Before entering foot wears to be removed & arranged regularly in the veranda of library.

3. Library shall be open from 09.30 a.m. to 04.30 p.m. when there are regular classes in the college.
4. Silence shall be strictly observed in all parts of the Library.
5. Books may be borrowed from the library according to the following rules.
 - i. One Book at a time for a student.
 - ii. All marking, underlining, scribbling etc. in any book, periodicals etc. belonging to the library are absolutely forbidden.
 - iii. If a book is damaged or lost by a member, she shall pay the cost of the book in postage etc. and a fine to be levied at the direction of the librarian and the Management within a fixed time by them.
6. Members are not allowed to lend books taken out from the library.
7. If a book is not returned on the due date, a fine of Rs. 5/- per day will be levied until the book is returned.
8. If the due date falls on a college holiday or on a day on which the library is not open, the book may be returned without fine on the next day.
9. Absence on illness of a student shall not be regarded as an excuse for not returning the books on the dates.
10. Newspapers, periodicals shall not be removed from the library.
11. Reference books shall not be lent out to any of the member.
12. Any matter not covered by the rules given above, shall be decided by the Management, Principal and by the Librarian.
13. The change of rules and other details regarding the library will be published in the Library Notice Board from time to time.

SECURITY FACILITIES

As safety is the prime concern of the management floor wise CCTV's are installed in the college campus and hostel block. 24 hours security is provided by the management by appointing security personnel to watch over the main gate. To protect the campus from accidents fire extinguisher is placed on all floors. It is supervised and maintained by regular monitoring.

SPORTS AND GAMES

Sports are inevitable to develop a strong mind, confidence and develop a sense of team spirit and unity. The college is well equipped with both indoor and outdoor facilities like Chess, Carom Board, Basket Ball, Kho-Kho, Kabbadi, Volley Ball, Shuttle Badminton, Tenni-Koit, and Athletics.

The Canteen is situated inside the college campus to serve snacks, Tea/Coffee at reasonable rates in a hygienic and organic atmosphere.
